Stroud Morris Dancers

The origins of Morris Dancing are lost in the depths of time, but references to it have been traced back as early as the 14th Century in England, and slightly earlier in mainland Europe.

There are many different forms of Morris Dancing, but in this part of the country it is Cotswold Morris that is most widely seen.

Stroud Morris Men started in 1978, with Stroud Morris Ladies being formed the following year. Sadly, due to members moving to other parts of the country, the men stopped dancing 3 years ago, but the Ladies are dancing stronger than ever before.

Stroud Ladies, whose repertoire and style are unique, were the first womens Cotswold side to be invited to dance at Sidmouth International Folk Festival and have once again been asked to perform there this year, as well as at Warwick Festival.

Stroud Morris Dancers don't just dance in England. In the last few years they've danced at festivals in Poland and Germany, and in 2008 were guests of Cambrils Bal des Bastons - a Catalan (Spain) stick dancing team whose dances share a common origin with Morris.

Each Morris side has its own particular costume. Strouds red and green colours are taken from the Stroud town crest. The red symbolises the military cloth that it once produced and the green - the green hills that surround the town.
